Dr. Schwabe's research focuses on economic and policy issues associated with water use, drought, and climate change, particularly among and across urban, agricultural, and environmental sectors. His papers have appeared in wide range of publications, including the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences* and *Nature Sustainability,* is co-editor of two books on water titled, <u>Drought in Arid and Semi-Arid Regions: A Multi-Disciplinary and Cross-Country Perspective</u>, and <u>The Handbook of Water Economics</u>. Dr. Schwabe received a BA in Mathematics and Economics at Macalester College, an MS in Economics at Duke University, and a PhD in Economics at the North Carolina State University.
